How would you feel if you went through the kinds of abrupt changes that the evacuees did? As an evacuee you are suddenly placed in a crowded shelter many miles from home. You are cut off from most of the people you know. You are dependent on the charity of the government and others. You are in shock. Your options are very limited.

A few weeks later you find yourself in an empty apartment or trailer with some basic furniture, clothes and food. You get your children into school and hunt for a job. The new job does not pay as much as you had been previously making.

One big question is if you will return or not to your home. Would it be better to stay and rebuild your life in this strange place? Or would it be better to return and rebuild with the difficulties that includes? And if you are going to return, then when will you leave?

GOLDEN RULE

Think about what would be like if you were in their shoes and they were in your shoes. In that case then what would you what them to do to help you? The Golden Rule says to do unto others as you would have them do unto you. How might that saying of Jesus apply in this situation? (Luke 6:31)
